Some of you have competed in Surf Canada events before and for some of you this will be your first time, and we hope you are just as stoked about competing this year at Cox Bay as we are!

Each year we strive to make this competition better for all surfers and spectators and we feel like this year's event will be another very memorable one! We hope to see you at Cox Bay, April 14-16, for this year's Rip Curl CANAM Surfing Championships. - 2) In order to ensure zero conflict-of-interest, 3 World Surf League (WSL) Officials will be judging, along with ISA accredited judges. Live priority and scores will be utilized.
- 3) If eligible, Surfers are permitted to register for more than one category. Surfers can only register for either Pro or Open, not both. There is no discount for multiple entries.
- 4) ****SPECIAL NOTE**** All Surfer's ages are taken as of January 1, 2023. Therefore, an U18 surfer may not turn 19 between January 1 and December 31, 2023. A U16 competitor may not turn 17 between January 1 and December 31, 2023. Proof of age will be required to compete, and no competitors under 12 years of age*(exceptional circumstances will be considered)
- 5) Rip Curl CANAM is open to all surfers, irrespective of nationality.
- 6) Please be mindful that we are all guests in Tofino and all rules still apply; Pay Parking, No alcohol, No smoking, No fires directly on the beach, and Pets must be on leash at all times ([detailed information](#)) All Health protocols must be followed.

NATIONAL TEAM SELECTIONS

1. SurfCanada will nominate qualified athletes to compete in all the 2023 International Surfing Association (ISA) and Pan American Surfing Association (PASA) sanctioned events (Organizations). ISA and PASA competitions include Shortboard, Longboard,

SUP Surfing, SUP Racing, for both Men and Women. All selections will be administered by Surf Canada.

2. The ISA, PASA, and Pan Am Sports (PASO) determine the number of athletes that may compete at their events by establishing quotas and qualification system per discipline for each country participating, which also guide Surf Canada's Qualification System ([Document Centre](#))
3. Surf Canada's Guiding Principle is to select the very best competition surfers to represent Canada at the ISA and PASA events.

1. To be eligible for selection to **Team Canada** an athlete must at minimum:
 1. Be a Canadian Citizen
 2. Have a Canadian Passport that is valid until at least May 8, 2024
 3. Born on the year or before 2007

3. Due to the extremely tight time line between Team Selections and PASA Surfing Games, any surfers that will be competing for those positions must contact dom.domic@csasurfcanada.org to be added to the SurfCanada's LONGLIST of potential athletes, as there will be several administrative items that will need to be completed for eligibility well in advance, whether you qualify or not.
4. All nominated travelling Team athletes are 100% responsible for their own: travel costs and travel planning to Santa Catalina, Panama; food, equipment and preparation.
5. SurfCanada strongly recommends that self-selected Longlist athletes to Purchase a flight that is 100% refundable. Do not wait until after Rip Curl CANAM is completed. Your travel details will need to be submitted well in advance to SurfCanada, whether you qualify or not.

NOTICE OF DOPING CONTROL

Participants registered for the Rip Curl CANAM, and eligible to compete for a spot on the National Team must be aware that doping control may be conducted by the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES) in accordance with the Canadian Anti-Doping Program.

To avoid a positive test and the consequences of an anti-doping rule violation, athletes are encouraged to take the following steps:

- Check your medications: Use the Global DRO to determine if any prescription or over-the-counter medications or treatments you are using are banned by the WADA Prohibited List.
